STRAND 1

Unleashing Teacher Leadership

Powerful Coaching Cycles

Attend this session to explore a process for defining cyclical, strategic coaching plans grounded in increasing student achievement and teacher effectiveness.

Making Magic Happen During Development Time in Cluster

Explore how to leverage student work during development time to drive instructional planning, delivery, and measurement decisions.

Teachers in the Driver's Seat of Learning

A road map that allows meaningful and continuous opportunities to nurture a shared learning culture is critical to raising student achievement. Join us to engage in practices that build a culture of efficacy on your school campus.

Implementing the Five Steps for Effective Learning in Unique Collaborative Structures

This session allows leaders to apply the Five Steps for Effective Learning to overcome challenges they may face in structuring and scheduling cluster meetings and other collaborative professional learning opportunities.

Leveraging Student Support to Elevate Teacher Practice

Learn how to effectively elevate teacher practice by directly supporting students. This session highlights student-focused support, such as co-teaching and kid-watching, to elevate teacher practice.

Transforming School Leadership

Leader as Coach: Embracing Your Role as the Instructional Leader

Transforming the Student Experience Through Intentional Leader Actions

Raising Academic Achievement Through Strategic, Collaborative Planning

How do principals balance multiple areas of school improvement? Join us to explore a framework for conversations between school and teacher leaders to support the teaching and learning process behind weekly ILT meetings.

What Students Say Matters: Decision-Making that Empowers and Informs

Including student voice and agency in decision-making is more critical than ever. In this session, educators will examine the practices of a school where a student leadership team has been implemented to elevate students' roles in addressing school needs.

Words Matter: Reframing Our Language for Increased Learner Focus

A continuous focus on learners is critical to effective leadership practices. In this session, participants will discuss how to positively impact achievement by ensuring all conversations are focused on students.

STRAND 3

Ensuring Success Through Robust Instructional Practices

Learning Walks: Looking Beyond Teachers' Actions to Maximize Impact

Learning walks are a powerful process for defining learning for leaders within schools and districts. Learn how to maximize the impact of the learning walks process by defining learning expectations and reflecting on student work.

Increased Impact Through Content-Specific Coaching (ELA)

Coaching is the key to strengthening instruction and learning. How does an instructional leader elevate coaching practices by intentionally grounding reflection and feedback in content-specific pedagogy? This session will provide participants with techniques to strengthen coaching skills in ELA classrooms.

STRAND 4

The Power of Mission and Vision in Establishing Shared Leadership and Trusting Relationships

Are you launching a new ILT or welcoming new members? This session examines ways to leverage your school's mission and vision to foster shared leadership and trusting relationships that enable your ILT to lead school improvement efforts successfully.

School Improvement at the Speed of Relationships

Coaching for Teacher Ownership

Bubble Sessions

Bubble sessions allow educators to observe a collaborative learning opportunity being modeled by school and district leaders and facilitated by NIET leaders. Throughout the meeting, there will be "step-outs" where participants will reflect on what they are observing, and facilitators will unpack what they are learning. These sessions will each highlight a different collaborative learning opportunity: cluster/PLC meeting, instructional leadership team (ILT) meeting, and district instructional leadership team (D-ILT) meeting.

Participants will:

- Identify key elements of high-quality cluster/ PLC, ILT, or D-ILT meetings that build educator capacity to improve instructional practice.
- Analyze how cluster/PLC, ILT, or D-ILT meeting structures can accelerate educator impact.
- Determine the next steps for creating or strengthening cluster/PLC, ILT, or D-ILT meeting structures in their district or school.


