NIET's training and support for teachers seeking the Lead Professional Educator Designation empowers participants to grow as teacher leaders, leverage instructional expertise, make data-driven decisions, and foster collaborative partnerships. Teachers attend and engage in four core teacher leadership-focused virtual sessions and receive an on-site support visit.

- **Cohorts 1-3:** July 7, July 15-16, September 29-30, and January 12-13

- **Cohorts 10-12:** July 10, July 23-24, October 8-9, and January 26-27
