## BREAKOUT SESSION DESCRIPTIONS:

STRAND 1

### Unleashing Collaborative Structures

#### Supporting Individual Needs to Enhance Cluster Impact

Collaborative learning in clusters ensures positive student outcomes by providing opportunities to address the needs of individual teachers and students. Join this session to explore strategies to enhance the impact of cluster learning for students using existing structures.

#### **Designing Relevant Learning for Teachers**

Leveraging critical attributes is essential to ensuring cluster learning is relevant for teachers. Join us to explore how to elevate the use of critical attributes to impact student achievement and teacher effectiveness.

#### Building Teacher Leaders' Expertise Through the Classroom Inquiry Process

Continuous learning grounded in evidence-based instructional practices and student learning is foundational to the work of teacher leaders. This session explores how engaging in NIET's classroom inquiry process helps continuously develop teacher leaders' expertise in evidence-based practices.

#### Amplifying Growth of Teacher Leaders Through Intentional Supports

Developing effective teacher leaders in a school is a powerful strategy for addressing instructional equity. Explore practical approaches for the ILT to support and coach teacher leaders in implementing teacher collaboration, resulting in increased student achievement.

#### STRAND 2

### Maximizing Individualized Coaching

## Maximizing Teacher Support by Leveraging HQIM

Coaching and supporting teachers significantly impacts student outcomes. In this session, we will explore strategies to leverage HQIM when supporting teachers and create a plan to enhance the impact of teacher support.

#### Elevating Teacher Practices Through Peer Support

Leveraging peer support is vital when building a culture of collective efficacy that elevates teacher practices. This session highlights strategies for leveraging the expertise of career teachers to improve student outcomes schoolwide.

#### Empowering Teacher Leaders Through Reflective Coaching

School and district leaders build teacher leaders' skills by facilitating reflective practice and ongoing support. In this session, leaders will explore how to develop the coaching skills of teacher leaders by providing opportunities for coaching and reflection on the impact of teacher leader practices.

## School Leader Coaching as a Strategy for Continuous Improvement

Research confirms that principals have a significant impact on student learning outcomes. This session focuses on how to coach principals so that they, in turn, provide more effective support for teacher leaders and, ultimately, impact student achievement.

#### STRAND 3

### **Implementing Evidence-Based Practices**

#### Curriculum-Embedded Assessments: A Driver of Evidence-Based Instructional Practices

Formative assessments are a vital component of the instructional cycle. Participants will identify opportunities to strengthen teachers' understanding and use of formative assessment to propel learning forward for students.

## Enhancing Teacher Content Knowledge for Educator Empowerment

Teacher content knowledge empowers educators to provide high-quality instruction and facilitate meaningful student learning experiences. Participants will leave the session with actionable next steps to empower educators in enhancing their content knowledge.

## Using Student Work Analysis in Reflective Coaching

An ongoing data analysis cycle promotes evidence-based reflection that allows for intentional adjustment of instruction. Attend this session to learn how to use student work to build a teacher's reflective practice and shift instructional practices.

#### Unlocking the Full Potential of HQIM Through Evidence-Based Instructional Practices

How does knowledge of teaching and learning standards affect our work with teachers/teacher leaders? This session explores strategies for leveraging NIET's Teaching and Learning Standards within HQIM to support the work of teacher leaders.

#### **STRAND 4**

### **Creating Positive** Learning Environments

#### Establishing Positive Relationships Among Teachers

Trust, knowledge, and credibility of instructional leadership teams are essential when establishing positive teacher relationships. Join this session to analyze leadership practices that influence a campus culture of belonging among staff.

#### Supporting Teachers With Creating a Learning Environment With Rigorous Expectations

Optimizing instructional time to ensure each student meets their learning goals is essential when creating an equitable learning environment with high expectations. This session highlights specific practices embedded in the coaching and support of teachers to strengthen expectations within the learning environment.

#### Cultivating Respectful and Responsive Learning Environments

Developing a respectful and responsive learning environment begins with believing that students are capable of, and interested in, supporting one another. In this session, participants will establish success criteria to cultivate a respectful and responsive learning environment.

#### Nurturing Student Ownership: Teacher Leader Strategies

Creating a classroom environment that supports student ownership begins when teachers examine the instructional standards and content, including the curriculum, from the student's point of view. This session will explore teacher leader actions that support student ownership.

#### **STRAND 5**

### Bridging Early Career Support

#### Elevating Student Learning With Strategic Early Career Teacher Support

Providing early career teachers with strategic support can be a key factor in rapidly elevating practice. This session will explore specific techniques for enhancing professional learning for early career teachers and positively impacting student achievement.

#### Accessing Your Inner Teacher: Supporting Early Career Teachers to be Reflective Practitioners

Effective reflective practices established early in teachers' careers expedite instructional growth and students' success. Participants will learn how to establish intentional structures that promote reflective practices so that early career teachers become part of a culture of continuous improvement.

#### The Key to a Successful Learning Environment: Structuring Thinking and Problem-Solving

Structuring learning to promote thinking and problem-solving strengthens the learning environment. This session will unpack how to support early career teachers to structure thinking and problem-solving and create a learning environment that leads to student success.

#### Assessing Student Progress: Strategies for Early Career Teachers

When analyzing student work to improve instructional practices, early career teachers must determine student progress toward mastery of standards. This session explores a process early career teachers can use to interpret where students are in their learning progression.

### **Bubble Sessions**

Bubble sessions allow educators to observe a collaborative learning opportunity being modeled by school and district leaders. In these sessions, educators are seated around a center table where the meeting will occur, with participants surrounding them in a "bubble" to observe. During "step-outs" from the meeting, participants will reflect on what they are observing and facilitators will unpack what they are learning. Each session highlights a collaborative learning opportunity: cluster/PLC meeting, instructional leadership team (ILT) meeting, and district instructional leadership team (D-ILT) meeting.

#### **Participants will:**

- Identify key elements of high-quality meetings that build educator capacity to improve instructional practice.
- » Analyze how meeting structures can accelerate educator impact.
- » Determine next steps for creating or strengthening district and school meeting structures.


