

Changing Outcomes for Students in Rural Communities

In 2020, the National Institute for Excellence in Teaching (NIET) started an innovative partnership called the Arkansas Rural Educator Network (AREN) with the support of the Walton Family Foundation. NIET specialists engage with AREN districts to develop a customized, district-specific plan of support, which is designed based on a strengths-based needs assessment. Districts also receive on-site coaching, training, and support along with opportunities to collaborate with leaders across the state. AREN is currently serving 22 districts across the state of Arkansas.
